Oh no. We know where you're at right now. You've just laid new carpets, there's a rental inspection coming up, or you just cannot handle that pungent pee smell anymore.

Pet urine stains are nasty, no matter the other factors making it more and more stressful — it can be a serious pain.

Not only do they stink, but they're a stain you want to get in check before your pet considers that patch their new toilet. You can't blame them — it does smell like it.

The good news? **We have the solution. Introducing BioEnzymes Odour Eater products.**

The Odour Eater product is designed to — you guessed it — eat odours. What kind of odours? Cat and dog stains, their urine stains, general animal smells, as well as those yucky kid smells — like spilled milk in the car.

BioEnzymes' Odour Eater products literally eat these stains and their odours.

So, how does it work?

Basically, bio-enzymatic cleaners use good bacteria to fight bad bacteria. It's kind of like

those probiotic ads you see on TV — except instead of your gut, it's your couch, carpet, or car.

Your stain is made up of soil, and bacteria that want to eat the soil. The good bacteria come in, eat that soil, and soon enough, the bad bacteria have nothing to stick around for.

With the soil and bacteria gone, so is your stain. You can either wash the cleaner away or leave it there to continue protecting the surface.

How to remove pet urine stains with Odour Eater

Effectively wet the stained area

Start the process by first wetting the problem area. You don't need to absolutely soak it, but you do want the water to seep down to where you think the urine has soaked in.

This will enable the bacteria in the Odour Eater product to find their way to the urine quicker, allowing the product to clean the stain faster.

Of course, if you don't want to wet the area first, you don't have to. The bacteria will still remove the urine, it just won't work as efficiently.

Dilute your concentrate & apply the product

Mix the required amount of the Odour Eater product with tap water and apply it using a spray bottle. It's **important** you use a coarse jet to spray the product rather than lightly misting it. You can also simply pour or mop the product over the affected area.

If you're cleaning a stain on carpet or upholstery, try and cover the area with a towel or plastic to prevent the area from drying out too quickly. This helps encourage the bacteria and aids in the cleaning process. This will be more important in cold temperatures — around under 15°C.

If the odour you're cleaning is really strong, we do recommend using a mix of one part Odour Eater to one part water for the first application.

Repeat as necessary

If further applications are needed, you could use a mix of one part Odour Eater to three or four parts water.

What to be aware of

Don't mix chemicals

Don't mix Odour Eater with bleach or disinfectant!

Firstly, it's just good life advice to tell you not to mix chemicals. But secondly, we have **a really good reason.**

Bleach and disinfectant are designed to kill bacteria, which is usually perfect. In this case, though, Odour Eater is using clever and good bacteria that eat the stain. Once they've eaten the stain, they continue creating enzymes that protect that area, meaning you don't need to keep cleaning it.

Your bleach or disinfectant will basically kill the Odour Eater product, rendering it pointless. So, put down the other chemicals for now!

Don't store mixed product

Once you've diluted the concentrate with water, it's best to use all of it. Don't store the leftover mixed product. Instead, if you do find yourself with leftover mixed product, simply use it around the house.

While it's designed to be a stain and odour remover, as an enzyme cleaner, it's still an excellent.

Environmentally-friendly product

BioEnzymes' Odour Eater comes as a concentrated product that can be diluted with water. It offers more cleaning to the bottle than a ready-made cleaning product. This makes it a more environmentally friendly cleaning option.



The strongest enzyme cleaner on the market

Our Odour Eater product is the strongest on the market. The Odour Eater range features 10 strains of live bacteria, which is more than any other enzyme cleaner, and each litre holds a bacteria count of 50 billion live bacteria, give or take.



The fragrance gets to work before the cleaner

While some cleaning products opt to only use fragrance to cover the smell and not actually clean it, and others opt to only clean using enzymes but leave the scent — Odour Eater is different. It uses a fragrance to cover the smell until the bacteria have had time to work.



How long does it last? Is it cost-effective?

The BioEnzymes Odour Eater range comes in concentrated bottles to save space in landfill and give you more cleans per bottle. This depends on the amount of product used for each clean and the size of the stains you're cleaning. Say you have a 500ml spray bottle and you use one part of product to four parts water, you'll be looking at roughly 100ml of concentrate per bottle.

So, a \$40 1-litre bottle will give you ten applications. That means to fill your spray bottle once, you'll use roughly \$4 worth of the product.
